Pastor's Letter, December 2024—Living on the Edge

In 2024, I invited the congregation to journey through the church year in our worship, spiritual life, and faith formation dimensions of ministry with the year-long theme of <u>Meeting Jesus</u>. The idea was for us to spend the year getting to know Jesus more deeply so that when we do the work of our purpose statement, *Making Jesus Known*, we would have a deeper and richer understanding of who this Jesus is.

This year, we are building on that re-acquaintance with Jesus with a new focus for 2025. We want to invite you along to follow this same Jesus to the particular kinds of places and people where he leads us, especially to the folks on the margins and to the places beyond the routine and the familiar. So, our focus for the year beginning now with Advent (December 2024) will be Living on the Edge—Christianity Beyond Our Comfort Zones. You'll discover that the idea of practicing our faith "beyond our comfort zones" and following Jesus "on the edge" outside of the familiar and the routine is a central theme of Luke's gospel, which is actually the primary Gospel we'll be rooted in for Sunday worship in this year, using the Revised Common Lectionary. Luke's gospel in particular (as well as its companion book, Acts, which we will hear from throughout the year as well, especially in Eastertide) portrays Jesus as someone always on the margins of society, also leading his disciples beyond the familiar places of their comfort zones and into new adventures. Jesus is deliberately among the poor, the outcast, foreigners/Gentiles, the least, the lost, and the left-out in Luke's Gospel, and he calls his disciples to be among them as well. In our day and time, it can be tempting to see our Christian faith simply as a comfortable thing that never pushes us beyond the familiar or the routine. But Jesus never intends to leave us as we are: he stretches us, leads us, challenges us, and transforms us as we follow where he goes. That's what we want to invite you to be a part of in the year ahead.

And as a starting point, this Advent we'll be focusing on what it means to live *on the edge of hope*. As people who live in a world full of heartache, tragedy, brokenness, injustice, and war, we hope for God's promised renewal of all things. We look forward to the coming of Christ, like people watching the eastern sky for the first brightening shades of blue that tell us the dawn is breaking. In a sense, all of our lives are lived balancing on that line, on the edge between the brokenness of present reality and the wholeness for which we hope. That's where Jesus meets us, and from there, we go—well, we go where Jesus leads us.

So let this be a formal invitation for the year ahead as a congregation—not only to meet Jesus, but to go with him to the edges of our lives—out beyond the familiar, past the temptation to just "play church," and out among the mix of misfits, mess-ups, and broken hearts on the margins that Jesus always surrounds himself with.

Who knows where that might lead us as a congregation as we move into the next fifty years of our story? For sure it will be outward. Probably it will be somewhere we cannot quite predict. Certainly, it will be with Jesus.

From Vicar Natalie



Recently, I went on a silent retreat and stayed at a hermitage in Michigan. It is something I try to do annually for myself around this time of year. I always look forward to the time to rest and slow down. But I will say, it does take practice shutting my brain off. After having the time to settle in and decompress, I am able to have time that is rejuvenating with God, and it brings me comfort, peace, and rest. Often after these retreats, I remind myself though that while it is great to have an extended period of rest, it doesn't mean that I cannot find those moments throughout the year.

Advent is a time of waiting for the Messiah. It is a time to slow down, pause, breathe, to hear the good news for you, of Jesus Christ breaking into the world as Emmanuel, God with us. For those of us who have been long-time church attendees, we have heard these Advent texts over and over. I know for myself; they can sometimes become background noise having heard them so many times. But what if we decide that the way to find rest this season and to hear God's voice is to find moments in our busy days to pause, pray, read these scriptures slowly and more than once, despite the need to move this holiday at a fast pace? What if we also find ways through different spiritual practices in our home to connect to God and one another- lighting the Advent wreath, praying at mealtimes, setting up the manger with your children as you read the gospel story, singing or listening to your favorite Christmas carols and really pondering the lyrics, reading the advent devotional through the church, finding ways to serve our friends in need through meal services, charities, and activities.

Maybe we can't escape to a silent retreat for 3 days during this busy time. But the good news is that we have a God who meets us here and now in the unexpected and mysterious. And God's great story of Jesus coming to this earth is for you, to bring healing and hope to what has been on your heart, to bring comfort in your time of mourning, to set you free from what has weighed you down this year. As you travel to the manger with a few pit stops to help fill your cup, may God fill you with the promises of God's love, and hope and ignite in you a spirit of hospitality and service for your neighbor.

We are called to ponder myst'ry and await the coming Christ,
To embody God's compassion for each fragile human life.
God is with us in our longing to bring healing to the earth,
While we watch with joy and wonder for the promised Savior's birth.

This Advent, we are blessed to have our own Vicar Natalie again joining regulars Pastor Steve, and colleagues in ministry Erica Wellner, a Methodist, and Sarah Aasheim, a fellow Lutheran, as we look at the theme of "Hope in Exile." Every year, Christians around the world sing the ancient words from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," which continues, "...and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lonely exile here, until the Son of God appears." So, what did exile mean in the Biblical story, and what does it mean for our hope this season? What did it mean for the birth of Jesus that his homeland was under foreign occupation under the Roman Empire, or that he and his family had to flee to Egypt in a sort of exile as refugees escaping Herod? And how do we see all of our lives as Christians lived as "resident aliens" or "exiles" awaiting the new creation when God makes all things new? These are the questions we'll be exploring each week this December on Crazy Faith Talk—listen in this Advent!



GROWING IN GOD'S WORD



Last year in Advent, we offered an anthology of daily readings and prayers for the season, called Astonish Us Again, that dovetailed with the Scripture readings we are using in Sunday worship (which are also keyed into the Revised Common Lectionary). Because that was well-received, this year, we are pleased to offer a new compilation that will connect with our new theme for the year that begins with this Advent (Dec. 1). On the Edge of Hope is a new collection of original prayers and Scripture readings for each day in Advent, and it is available to you this year either as a printed booklet (in the Gathering Space), or a PDF compilation you can read on your phone, computer, or tablet, or as daily posts on our church Facebook page. These are free, original, and can be shared as far and wide as you would like. Check them out this Advent, as together journey on the edge of hope!





Advent Midweek Worship with Holden Evening Prayer

We call Jesus the "Prince of Peace," and we sing that on the night of his birth "all is calm, all is bright." But quite often our lives are especially hectic and stressful in the weeks before Christmas, aren't they? 


Blue Christmas Service Offers Comfort and Hope— Dec. 22 at 3:00 p.m.

New Thursday Bible Study Series: "Things Seen and Unseen"



"More Than Wishful Thinking: An Exploration of Christian Hope" Advent Adult Sunday School Series

Hope is a funny word. Sometimes we use it with bold confidence in spite of impossible odds: "Even though he was wrongfully imprisoned, he held onto hope that he would be vindicated and set free." Sometimes we use it as a polite way of expressing doubt, like when you say, "I hope it doesn't rain today," while the sky darkens with threatening clouds from the west. Emily Dickinson famously said that hope was "the thing with feathers that perches in the soul—and sings the tune without the words, and never stops at all..." And of course, as one hero in the Star Wars movies says about fighting against the Galactic Empire, "Rebellions are built on hope." That's a lot of range for one word to have to cover—and maybe it can be confusing for us as Christians to know what we are talking about when we say we are people of hope. This Advent season especially is one marked by both waiting and hope (which, fun fact, use the same word in Spanish!), as we hear the centuries-long hopes of prophets and exiles who waited and hoped for homecoming, for restoration, and for the arrival of the promised Anointed One (Messiah/Christ) of God. We also hear in these weeks the hope we have for God's new creation when all things are made new. So, what does it mean for us to be people of hope, and how is it different from just "wishful thinking" or mere optimism? That's what we want to explore in this December's Adult Sunday School series, running on December 1, 8, 15, and 22 between services. On all of those dates except the 22nd, we'll be in the fellowship hall, and on Dec. 22 we'll move to the Council Room to allow the kids to have the larger space for the Birthday Party for Jesus! We hope you'll join us around the table for good conversation and learning together this Advent in the Adult Class!



A Cherished Tradition - The Annual Covenant Renewal: Community of Christ


