





P Those who lived in a land of deep darkness-on them light has shined.





First Reading: Isaiah 9:2-7








The Gospel: Luke 2:1-20

Luke 2:1-7




P We commend these prayers to you, O God, trusting your grace made known to all, through the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**


**The Eucharistic Prayer Continues.....


The Lord's Prayer
