Pastor's Letter, February 2025—On the Edge of Our Comfort Zones

You know, it's funny. In the Bible, whenever Jesus is gathering disciples to be a part of his movement, he never leaves them unchanged. Jesus doesn't just hand people religious pamphlets and say, "See you in heaven," with a wink, before turning to walk away. He pulls people along for the journey to follow him—to go where he goes, to see the way he sees, to share his message, and to do what he does. That rarely leaves people in the same places or routines where he found them, and it never leaves them the same. Before all is said and done, the disciples of Jesus are given new courage to reach out to new people (including folks they would have thought before were too different, too bad, or too far away), a new vision to feed and care for those in need, and even new names (good old' Simon gets the new name Peter, and Saul starts going by the name of Paul). They are sent by Jesus to "all nations" with a love that includes not only family and neighbors nearby but also strangers and enemies. And they are constantly being led past the edge of their comfort zones, as they discover the Spirit nudging them to share the Good News of Jesus with people who had been hostile to them, people who were from different ethnic groups, and people from other nations, languages, and cultures. Jesus hadn't come to leave them in their old routines or mindsets, but to make something new out of them.

Jesus hasn't changed strategies, by the way. To be a follower of Jesus in 2025 runs the same risk as it did for the first-century fishermen and tax collectors who found themselves around Jesus' table. He will take us by the hand and lead us beyond our comfort zones, too. That might mean Jesus dares **you** to share your faith with someone at work, at school, or at the grocery store. It could mean that the Holy Spirit pulls **you** to take the time to sit and listen to the folks who sit alone at lunch or need the ear of a friend. It could look like a new ministry idea here at Community of Christ—like the "Conversations and More" group getting started this month, or the new energy building at Social Action Ministry. It might mean that, like our confirmation students going to experience worship at Temple Shomer Emunim, you are led to learn about your neighbor's faith and to discover God's presence there in unexpected ways. It might mean that **you** step up to volunteer in role or join a ministry that you have never tried before, from assisting in Sunday worship to sewing with the quilters to helping serve meals at Salem Lutheran in Toledo once a month to singing along with residents at Blue Creek Nursing Home. Whatever it is, be prepared for Jesus to call you beyond what is familiar and out of our comfort zones.

Somewhere along the way, I think a lot of us got into the mindset that our faith does the opposite—that we believe in God in order to be *insulated* from the changes or challenges of the outside world, or that God's job is just to preserve "The Way Things Are" (or to cajole the world back to some imagined perfect "Way Things Used To Be" from our rose-colored reminiscences). But that's not the way the Scriptures actually talk, and it's not the way Jesus' movement in the world looks, either. No, the prophet says, "Do not consider the former things, and do not remember the things of old—I am about to do a NEW thing!" And the apostle says, "If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation! The old has passed away—look, everything is being made new!" And Jesus, too, sends his disciples from the epicenter of resurrection with a new commandment and a new commission: to love all, the way he has first loved us, and to make disciples of all nations. None of that sounds like going back to "the way we've always done it," but rather, it sounds like being led to the

edge of our comfort zones. And it sounds like a joyous and exuberant adventure to be a part of. So, good news: Jesus has already taken us by the hand to lead us with him. And we take the next step, with him, together.

THE BOOM

From Vicar Natalie Downs

"Surely God is my salvation;
I will trust and will not be afraid,
for the Lord is my strength and my might;
he has become my salvation."
Isaiah 12:2



Dear friends, I want to first extend a heartfelt thank you for your prayers and kind words during my unexpected time of hospitalization and recovery. Your kindness, love, and compassion have been a help during that sudden emergency. Thank you!

When I was serving at the hospital as a chaplain completing my clinical pastoral education, we talked in our lecture time about what my instructor liked to call THE BOOM. Here is how THE BOOM would happen: we go about our everyday lives, doing the things that we have on our to-do list, the places to be, the people to see, and then suddenly, BOOM! Something happens that stops us in our tracks, whether it is a medical emergency or trauma, causing life to become shaky. Working in the hospital as a chaplain, I went into many rooms where people talked with me about their own BOOMS that landed them sitting in a hospital bed. I have listened to their stories, held their hands, and prayed with them. I have laughed, listened, comforted, and cried with them. The hospital and emergencies in our life can reveal to us our vulnerability as humans, which can be scary. We get sick, things happen that catch us off guard. And I found myself growing anxious as I found myself in the hospital, hearing I had to be admitted, and would need to have surgery - BOOM! And to be honest, I was afraid, especially waiting for test results, waiting to hear from doctors, and my stress and anxiety were climbing. And then, the Vicar of Whitehouse (that's me!) had to chaplain herself. I reminded myself of the truth I hold even in the midst of my chaos, that even in the BOOM moments, God walks with us. God is not separate from us, keeping a distance from us and the hard things in this human life. I believe in the God who is present. Jesus who says, "Remember, I am with you always to the very end of the age." I believe in the God who says when we go through hard things or "pass through the waters," God is with us. Going into the MRI machine (an experience I never had before), I used a breath prayer (based on Isaiah 12:2) to help me through that 25minute procedure in a loud, small enclosed space to remind me of God's presence. I breathed in, and I thought "The Lord is my strength, and my salvation," breathing out, "I will not be afraid." In and out, those words repeated over and over for me as my prayer, and it brought me peace, slowing down my breath and keeping me calm. I used my Hallow app when the anxiety would heighten to take it to God and dwell in meditative prayer. We all have BOOM moments in our lives, whether they are small moments that disrupt our day, or bring an upheaval to our lives. The good news is that we have a God who loves us so much that the scriptures tell us repeatedly that God will not leave us, even in the worst of the worst moments. And we in those moments can turn to God, trusting in this love and relationship of a God who goes with us on the journey. Thanks be to God!




Advent Adult Sunday School Series: "Jesus—The Wonder Years"

Choir Updates!


Our upcoming choir segment begins on Wednesday, January 29th, at 7:00 p.m. for rehearsal with Lisa!

Monthly Singing Visit to Blue Creek Nursing Home February 11 at 10:00 a.m.












Community of Christ Enjoys Walleye Hockey and Pizza!

A great time was had by all at the Walleye hockey game, followed by pizza at Pizzapapalis! Thank you to everyone who attended and to those who helped organize the event!















A Disciple's Way of Life
