Pastor's Letter, March 2025-Love Beyond Boundaries

I don't know about you, but growing up, I had mixed feelings about the season of forty days we call Lent.

I recall the routine of weekly Wednesday meals shared with church family (a tradition I am grateful to experience again here at Community of Christ), and I can still remember the smell of a church fellowship hall filled with comingling aromas of chicken-noodle, vegetable beef, and cream of potato from my childhood. I remember the somber feeling of midweek Wednesday evening services as a kid, too, and the awareness that it was starkly different from the joyful energy of Sunday mornings. And yet at the same time, I really came to appreciate the quiet insistence of this season that God's love had gone to a cross for me. I know it might sound strange to say I get "excited" about Lent, or that I "like" it, given how sobering and serious these forty days are, and yet I do feel like something in my spirit needs the clarity, the sparseness, and the renewed call in Lent that pulls me to follow after Jesus even when it is costly. It might not be happy, per se, but it is good for my soul. It might not be celebratory like Easter or festive like Christmastide, and yet I need the rhythm of regularly stripping away the distractions and background noise of my life that allows my attention and focus to be turned once again on the cross of Jesus and what it means for me to follow the Crucified One as Lord.

Maybe this doesn't sound like much of a sales pitch. But then again, I'm not here to "sell" you on Lent, only to invite you to share this journey once again with us as a church family. For many centuries, the peculiar people called "church" have marked out time each year that clears the ground away for our hearts, hands, and habits to be recentered on the journey to the cross, and we have kept at it even though it doesn't have the hoopla of New Year's, the decorations of December, or the fireworks of the Fourth of July. We keep coming back to this shared journey of forty days because it helps us to be re-attuned to the center of our faith: the love that was willing to lay down its own life, all the way to death on a cross, a love so powerful that it has broken the power of death in the act of dying. In other words, we keep this season of Lent because it is one way we have found to keep ourselves re-grounded in the audacious love of God, a love that is richer and deeper than the pastel shades of colored eggs but comes dressed in the royal purple of Good Friday's robe and the deep red of blood.

Len Pastor's Letter, March 2025—Love Beyond Boundaries

This year in particular, as our focus for 2025 on "Life on the Edge: Christianity Beyond Our Comfort Zones" continues, I want to invite you to share in this Lenten season with particular attention to that love, and how in Christ, we encounter a *love beyond boundaries*. We'll hear in these weeks about how God's love for a whole world full of us sinners is like the reach of a joyful father racing toward a long-lost son who has burned every other bridge he has. We'll hear about how Jesus' love longs to reach out for us like a mother hen putting her own life between the danger and her brood. We'll hear how Christ was willing to die for us, not merely when we are well-behaved and righteous, but precisely when we are sinners still turned away from God. In other words, we'll be reminded again of just how fierce, insistent, and relentless God's love for us is as it crosses boundaries, removes obstacles, and goes to any length for the sake of reaching us. In a culture and in a time when so many other messages to us are mere sale pitches or just angry shouting, we need to hear that Good News—and we might just need a whole season of forty days or so to remove the distractions, ignore the commotion, and allow our hearts to hear it.

So, join us this Lent here at Community of Christ for a season of *love beyond boundaries*—which is first and foremost God's love for us, and then flows through us to reach out to others as witnesses of Christ's love. Join us in worship, in study, in service, and in shared time in community. I can't promise that this Lent will be glamorous, sparkly, or trendy—but I'm not sure that's what we need. I can invite you to a season that will be simply centered on the One who gave everything and crossed every boundary to redeem us and to share that together as the people of God. Come find a place here. Come and find what we most deeply need.

The Places That Form Us

"Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common."

Acts 4:32

At the beginning of every semester, I jump in the car with my fellow seminary friend, Vicar Jacinda, and we venture west to Dubuque, Iowa, back to the castle (Wartburg Seminary). It is a special place. Every time we see the castle from a distance down the road, a smile spreads across our faces. Joy fills our hearts entering our on-campus house to be greeted by friends from far and wide. It is a place of learning and a time of gathering together as a worshipping community. This is a formative place where I am discerning how God is calling me to show up in the world as a Christian public leader through learning and listening to God's word and allowing the Spirit to breathe life into action. As I reflect on the importance of community and the formational element it brings, I am drawn to the text from Acts that talks about the early church. Before Bibles, church doctrine, and church buildings, they lived by simple means. Being in community with each other. Sharing what they had. And in doing so, they "were of one heart and soul." And when we too practice the gift of hospitality and welcome, I am assured through this community's witness and in the life of the church that God is there, and God will grow us in those formative times and spaces.

For the next few weeks in Bible Study on Sunday mornings, we will have a chance to talk about formative communities as we read an early church document known as the Didache, the teaching of the twelve apostles. My hope is that you will join us for this study as we talk about the early formative times of the church and also join in discussion around what it means to be a community forming disciples for the church and the world today. And I pray in our time together in worship and learning on Sundays that Community of Christ is a place where you are being formed and sent out into the world. Join us for this exciting discussion!

Ash Wednesday Begins Lent on March 5

This year, our shared Lenten journey to the cross and the hope of resurrection that lies through it begins on March 5 with Ash Wednesday. Here at Community of Christ, we'll once again offer worship at 7:00 p.m. including the Imposition of Ashes and the celebration of Holy Communion, and we'll offer a shared light meal together at 5:30 p.m. first in the fellowship hall, as in previous years.

In case the tradition of *imposing ashes* is new to you—or in case you have always wondered what it's all has much older roots in ancient Judaism that connected ashes with public repentance. The marking of our foreheads with ashes in the shape of the cross is meant to be a reminder of our mortality, a sign of our own turning from sin, and a symbol of hope in Christ as well, all at the same time. As our heads are marked with the sign of the cross in a mix of dust, ash, and oil, we hear the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Of course, we remember as well what God can do with dust since the storytelling of the Scriptures describes God making humanity out of the dust and breathing life into the clay shaped by God's own hand. We also remember how the cross of Christ was marked on our foreheads in our baptism, and how God's claim of love on us holds onto us through this life, through death, and into the promise of resurrection, much like our journey this Lent along with Jesus to the cross and eventually Easter's empty tomb. So even though it is a difficult reminder to hear that our lives are not permanent and to be reminded of our sin, we also receive the ashes in the hope that the One who went to the cross for us has still claimed us as his own forever. This year, our ashes have been made, with the help of our confirmation students, from the burning of last year's palms from Palm Sunday, continuing a long-standing tradition in the church where last year's "Hosannas" point toward this year's Lenten journey to the cross.

You are invited to join us on Wednesday, March 5 for worship at 7:00 p.m., and to share dinner with us beforehand at 5:30 p.m. here at Community of Christ. Sign up at the kiosk if you are willing to help bring something for our Wednesday, meals and share this journey of forty days together this Lent with all of us here at Community of Christ!

Midweek Evening Prayer Lenten Series: Love Beyond Boundaries

Throughout the Wednesdays of Lent (running through March and into the beginning of April), we will once again be offering a series of simple shared meals and evening prayer services to mark our journey that takes us to the cross of Christ. As in previous years, our weekly Wednesday meals will start at 6:00 p.m. (beginning March 12—the Ash Wednesday dinner starts a half hour earlier at 5:30 p.m.) and worship will follow at 7:00 p.m. Continuing something we began last year, we'll also invite your help with hands-on creative projects that will help connect us with some of the central stories of our faith along the way to the cross and resurrection, and you can be a part of these between dinner and worship, with the materials and projects set up in the Gathering Space. Our Wednesday series this year will be for all ages, including children and adults, and we hope you'll make the time to join us this year for this special Lenten series, focused on the seasonal theme "Love Beyond Boundaries" as part of our 2025 Life on the Edge: **Christianity Beyond Our Comfort Zones** year.




New Canvas Labyrinth Offers Contemplative Prayer Opportunity

Frederick Buechner once wrote that "faith is the direction our feet begin to move when we discover that we are loved" by God. There's something to that idea—faith isn't stationary but points us in a certain direction and gets us moving as God leads us along life's path... including all of its twists and turns. With that in mind, we offer this Lent a new resource for your own contemplative prayer: an 18-foot diameter canvas prayer labyrinth, created in part with the help of our confirmation students earlier this winter. It will be set up and available for quiet times of walking in the fellowship hall at different times throughout this Lent, and you are invited to come by and make use of it.

In case you aren't familiar with the prayer practice of walking a labyrinth, here's the short version: unlike a maze, which has many paths which lead to dead-ends and wrong turns, a prayer labyrinth has only one path, but it turns, bends, and folds in on itself on the journey to the center in ways you might not be able to anticipate at first. When you walk the path, you have to trust that it will take you where you are supposed to go, even if you can't see how you'll get there at the end. And as you walk, slowly, quietly, and reflectively, your mind and heart are freed to pray, to listen, and to meditate on the presence of God while your feet are otherwise occupied walking. (It's not all that different from folks who say they find it easier to concentrate their minds when their hands are fidgeting or doing busy work.) Walking a prayer labyrinth can be paired with silent prayer, talking out loud to God, reciting the words of the psalms, or repeating a centering prayer phrase as you walk, making room for God to speak into the silence. 
Adult Forum this March: Walking the Jesus Way (Lessons from the Didache)

It's not just about hearing Bible verses on Sunday only to have them go in one ear and out the other, but about a way of life-a life shaped in Jesus' likeness. So, what could it look like to live the Jesus way of life today? And what wisdom can we gather from the early disciple community? That's what our Sunday Adult Forum will be exploring in our next series, running through March and into April, which we're calling, "Walking the Jesus Way." This series will make use of an ancient document that goes back to the late first century or the early second, a writing called "The Didache," which means "The Teaching [of the Apostles]." It may well be as old as some of the later books of the New Testament itself, and it gives a glimpse not only of the early church's life and witness but also offers a pattern for our own lives walking in the Jesus way. This Lent, as we focus especially on rededicating and recentering our lives on the way of Jesus, this series will be a great chance both to learn some ancient church history and to connect to present-day life application. We hope you'll join us on Sunday mornings in the fellowship hall from 9:00 - 9:50 a.m. for this series throughout March and leading up to Holy Week in April, as together we walk the Jesus way!



New Thursday Bible Study Series Begins: When God Breaks the Rules

We often picture God as the Giver of Rules and the Maker of Laws (including, obviously, the ones literally written in stone like the Ten Commandments). But what about the times in the Bible when God does a new thing, moves in a new direction, or expands the old order of the world? What about when God breaks the rules? That's what we're going to be looking at in our next Thursday afternoon Bible Study series, starting this January and running through the end of March, in a new original ten-part study that Pastor Steve is calling When God Breaks the Rules. We'll see how God overturned the customs and traditions of the day from the earliest stories in our Bible to times when Jesus broke with the inherited traditions of the Respectable Religious Teachers of his day, to the movement of the New Testament era church as the Spirit led the first Christians across lines and borders to the ends of the earth with Jesus' love. Community of Christ Welcomes Isaiah 117 House Presentation this March

When children are removed from their homes out of concern for their safety, they are usually brought to a child welfare services office to await placement. This wait can be a few hours to several days. These children often have nothing with them and are scared, lonely, hungry, and in dirty clothing.

Here in Northwest Ohio, a new ministry is beginning following a model that has been successfully used in other places across the country to help support children waiting to enter foster care. It's called Isaiah 117 House (inspired by the Bible verse in its name, "Learn to do good, seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow"), and right now efforts are building, and funds are being raised to establish an Isaiah 117 House location in the Toledo area.

Here's how it works: Isaiah 117 provides a comforting home where these children entering foster placement instead can be brought to wait – a place that is safe with friendly and loving volunteers who provide clean clothes, smiles, toys, and snuggly blankets. This space allows children to receive the comfort and care they need while child welfare staff can do the necessary paperwork and identify a good placement. The mission of Isaiah 117 House is threefold: to reduce trauma for children awaiting placement, to lighten the load for child welfare services, and to ease the transition for foster families. And here at Community of Christ, our Social Action Ministry sees this as the kind of work that we are being called to help support. To that end, we're welcoming a representative of the new initiative of Isaiah 117 House, Jennifer Bohnsack, to join us on Sunday, March 16, both to share a Temple Talk in worship and to present information in the Gathering Space between services. We'll also be directing our Noisy Offering, Thank-You Fund, and Daily Bread donations for the second quarter of the year (April, May, and June) to the work of Isaiah 117 House to help this project get off the ground. Come on March 16 and find out more about how we can use our resources to help children at one of the most difficult times of their lives to be surrounded by people who care about them and can offer comfort when everything else seems uncertain in their lives. (And see more in this newsletter about our "Have Mercy" sticker and button project, Too, which will also benefit Isaiah 117 House this Lent!) Social Action Ministry Invites You to "Have Mercy" and Share It Boldly This Lent

Weekly in our worship life, we pray, sing, and confess our need for it: the mercy of God. From the ancient call-and-response rhythm of the Kyrie, "Lord, have mercy..." to our sung acclamation before the gospel, "Return to the Lord, your God, who is gracious and merciful..." to the prayer petitions and well-known hymns of centuries past, we are grounded in the mercy of God. And as Jesus reminds us in the Sermon on the Plain, we are called to "be merciful, just as your Father in merciful" (Luke 6:36). Mercy is both our hope and our calling, and the church's season of Lent is a fitting time to be focused again on both of those since these forty days leading to Holy Week point us toward God's mercy poured out for us in the cross and resurrection of Jesus.

With all of that in mind, the Social Action Ministry invites you to make a statement this Lent that calls to mind both our prayer to God and Jesus' instruction to us to "have mercy." These new stickers and lapel buttons, each featuring the simple message, "Have mercy," will be available in the Gathering Space all throughout Lent, and we would invite your suggested donation for one of \$5.00, which can just go in the slotted box alongside the display, and all our proceeds will go to the ministry of Isaiah 117 House as they seek to show mercy to children in Northwestern Ohio who are going through foster placement (read more about their work in a separate article in this newsletter!). We hope you'll boldly put one of these stickers or buttons on something you wear or carry around with you as a way to start a conversation, prompt a faith conversation, or to remind you both of God's grace and our calling to be merciful people. 
Concert News




